

SERC has joined with the Center for Behavioral Education and Research (CBER), six Regional Educational Service Centers (RESCs) in Connecticut, and the Connecticut State Department of Education (CSDE) to establish the Connecticut PBIS Collaborative. The Collaborative works to standardize Connecticut's approach to training and supporting districts and school-based teams in PBIS implementation through shared training materials and resources. SERC has also developed a comprehensive statewide database of all schools trained by CBER, SERC, and RESCs. In the fall of 2014, Connecticut was one of twelve states awarded the School Climate Transformation Grant (SCTG). Connecticut's focus is on building capacity of state-level PBIS trainers and coordinators, building capacity of districts to coordinate and implement PBIS, and aligning with current funding sources.
